Ater many weeks of exploring causes for the parking lot light outage, we have discovered that the electricity is not being carried from the building to the poles. In order to get to the source of the problem the lot would need to be broken up and the electrical line pipe would need to be inspected.

Due to the fact that we will be replacing sewers and repairing the lot as part of the capital campaign, tearing up the lot and exploring is premature.

We have been advised, and are moving forward with a plan to install temporary lighting on top of the existing poles and running overhead lines from the building to the poles to provide temporary lighting.

Are you wondering what you can do to help those who have no warm place to return to at night? UCE is one of the 6 faith communities in Evanston providing warm shelter to those who are homeless this winter. We've done this in past years, and those who stay with us are always very appreciative.

#### **Volunteer shifts include:**

- The 8-9:30PM Set Up Cots; Prepare warm drinks, greet guests and help them get settled.
- The 9PM-7AM Spend the night. Generally, they have a chance to sleep, and a cot or chair is always available. They are there to assist the paid overnight staff person.
- The 6AM.-7:30AM Help to waken guests, move or fold up cots, clean up, serve hot drinks, and help the guests feel welcomed as they leave.



#### **REAL Library**


Three new books of note are now at the Racial Equity Lending Library.

The Color of Law. A Forgotten History of How Our Government Segregated America by Richard Rothstein brilliantly describes the unconstitutional actions of our government during the 20th century, which put in place the ghettos we find today in our cities. This book is a selection of the Nonfiction Book Club at UCE.

A More Beautiful and Terrible History by Jeanne Theoharis discusses


the intentional distortion of civil rights history and reveals a fresh understanding of our present situation. Suggested by Ms. Betty Ester, Evanston activist.

Lastly, Race and Reunion: The Civil War in American Memory by David W. Blight is a winner of the Frederick Douglass Book Prize and "shows what was remembered, what was forgotten, and why." This book was suggested by Rev. Wiviott after her memorable sermon last Memorial Day.
