Capital Campaign Q & A

Q. Why is sanctuary cooling a proposed Capital Campaign project? We have reduced programming over the summer months, and many people are out of town for vacation.

A With year-round minister-led summer services, our Sunday attendance has increased significantly over the last five years. We've outgrown Room 3, where we used to gather in the past.

Even with lake breezes, Evanston summers are hot and humid, and cooling will make the sanctuary a more welcoming place on sweltering Sunday mornings, especially for our guests and visitors. We would also have the option of scheduling congregational and community programming on summer evenings and weekends.

And there are other concerns that cooling in the sanctuary would address:

- **1.** UUA security personnel and Evanston police emphasize that we should have only *one* building entrance open for public events. That eliminates natural air circulation in the sanctuary.
- **2.** UCE has lost summer rental revenue because of our lack of comfort control in the sanctuary. Ours is an especially beautiful venue for weddings, and they -- along other rental events -- not only provide us with income but introduce the community to the congregation.

Progress Bar Bans Rap and Hip Hop Music

The Lighthouse Church of Chicago UCC is hosting "Racial Justice Summit: Boystown and Beyond" on Saturday, July 13, 2019 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at St. Pauls UCC, 2335 N.Orchard St., Chicago IL. (The Lighthouse Church of Chicago UCC is located within St. Pauls UCC.) The event is co-sponsored by the Chicago Metropolitan Association/Illinois Conference, United Church of Christ and Chicago Coalition of Welcoming Churches. The summit will address the pervasiveness of racism within the LBGT community and form a locally based coalition to tackle the issue.

From Windy City Times: "Lighthouse Pastor Jamie Frazier states the event is intended for clergy of LGBT-welcoming churches and their parishioners, as well as anyonewho considers themselves an ally of LGBT persons of color.

"The event is announced after weeks of a large-scale controversy which erupted after the owner of Progress Bar issued a dictum that rap and hip hop music would be banned in the bar, an edict that has often been regarded as a tacit ban on persons of color in other locales. Allegations of racism were also leveled against the store Beatnix in Boystown."

Time is running out

Accepting Shared Offering Nominations 2019-2020
One of the most important avenues for carrying out UCE's social justice mission is through the selection of organizations with whom we share half the proceeds of the weekly offering plate. The amount projected for giving to these organizations in the 2019-20 budget is \$18,500. The amount any of the 13 organizations selected to share our offering plate may vary depending on the month and vagaries of donations to the plate. But it



will be a significant donation for many organizations.

The Social Justice Council (SJC), which is made up of the different Social Justice Teams in our church, and staffed by our Acting Senior Minister Rev. Eileen Wiviott, is tasked with selecting recipient organizations for our Share the Plate program. This next fiscal year the SJC will follow the procedure initiated last year for selecting organizations to better reflect our values and mission. The organizations do not need to be ones UCE members work with or volunteer at; nor need they be based in Evanston or the Chicago metropolitan area. There will be no single criteria for inclusion other than that they must be 501(c)(3) organizations (or have a fiscal agent) and have a social justice mission. Instead, we will look for whether they meet at least 3 criteria from among the 14 that we have agreed are important, not all of which criteria would be true of any one organization.
