### From Rev. Karen Gustafson, Interim Minister



Dear ones,

Some years back, I attended the Unitarian Universalist Church of Rochester, Minnesota on the first Sunday in May. On the grounds of the church stands a maypole. After the service everyone was invited out into the spring sunshine to join in the ritual of weaving the colors of summer and new life. Amid singing and laughter, and some intense and serious (and less obvious) direction from some seasoned maypole dancers, we wove together individual strands into a beautiful monument to human spirit, creative energy and disciplined know-how.

When I imagine this interim process at its best, this is the image that I see. In September, you identified strands of story and structure, assets and challenges, and strategies. In October, you engaged in reflection and chose quality over reactivity in your consideration of an extended interim. Like the weaving of a maypole which looks so easy when the dance is happening, the grounding of a congregation in sustainable structures and relationships involves much planning and preparation.

## Attend Transgender Inclusion in Congregations



Transgender Inclusion in Congregations is a 6-part series created by the Transforming Hearts Collective and offered at UCE by Rev. Eileen and Christine Peters. This course is for anyone who wants to take their knowledge and skills to the next level in terms of gender diversity and trans identity and learn how to create congregations that are fully inclusive and actively affirming. Over six sessions we will deeply explore the intersection of trans identity, spirituality and faith community in order to gain grounding, context, and skills to transform ourselves and our congregation. The course meets people where they are and will move us toward welcoming,

relationship-building, and skills-building. Each session will include a webinar video, individual and group reflection, and discussion on topics ranging from what does Beloved Community really mean; the ways trans folks have been and remain marginalized; and ways our congregation can more fully celebrate and nurture the spirits of all people.

### Coming up on November 12th...

#### Session 2: Gender and Our Faith Community

Gender roles and expectations show up in all kinds of subtle ways in society and in congregational life. In this session we will dig into what we've been taught about gender and explore the role of gender in our lives and in our congregations.

In this session you will:

- Review the origins and impacts of gender binary roles and how they connect to and uphold patriarchy
- Explore gender roles and patriarchy within organized religion (with an emphasis on Unitarian Universalism)—historically and also how they play out today in your congregation and at large
- Reflect on the faith grounding for how we are called, as people of faith, to dismantle gender-based oppression

## Message from the BOT and the Ministerial Search Committee

Thanks to everyone who was able to attend the Town Hall meeting on Sunday, October 20th. *After the Board of Trustees, the Search Committee, and Reverend Eileen gave short presentations about our interim, we received comments and questions from the congregation about extending the Interim/Search for one more year.* In case you were unable to attend that meeting, here are some of the questions that were asked that day and some of the answers provided by Susan Carlton, the Chair of the Search Committee:

### What is the process that a Search Committee goes through?

A Search Committee is generally constituted in March or April. The Committee participates in a workshop with UUA staff in April and begins creating a Congregational Record, a document ministerial candidates use to determine if they will apply for the position. A congregational survey is distributed in late August to be completed by the third or fourth week in September. Focus groups and cottage meetings are conducted in late September and October. 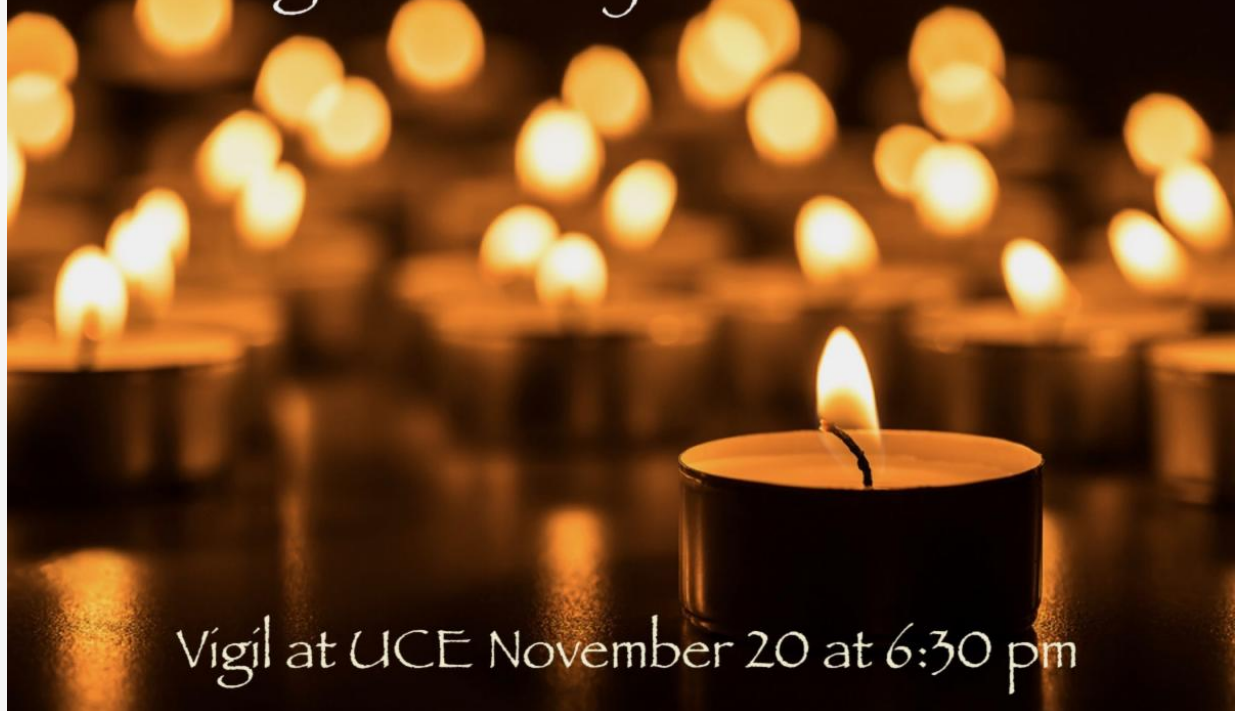
### Hats off to our awesome kitchen volunteers!

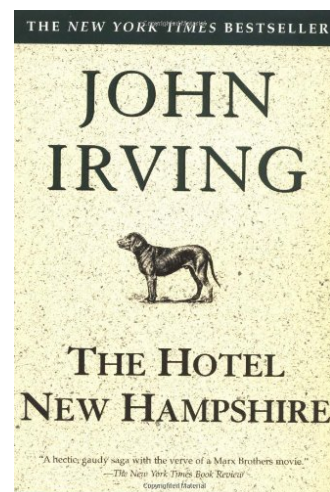

At this meeting, they will also choose the next three books for January, February, and March.

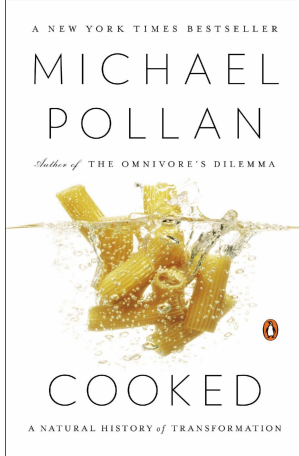

Giving by Text is now possible for four areas:  
Shared Plate Offering, Coffee & Bagels, UCE Operating Fund  
and Capital Campaign.

Send a text message to **312-584-9160** with the amount you would like to contribute and *the code* for where you would like it to go (e.g., **50 OFFERING**). Valid codes are **OFFERING** (Shared Plate Offering), **PLEDGE** (Pledge Payment), **CAP** (Capital Campaign), or **BAGELS** (for coffee/bagels). Example text: **50 OFFERING** (give \$50 to the shared offering). If you forget the funds, simply type in **FUNDS** and the list will pop up.

Within a few minutes, you'll be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and debit or card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt of your donation via e-mail. For future giving, send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically! You can even text "repeat" to make it a recurring donation. Text giving is one of the fastest, easiest ways to give. We hope you enjoy this new way to share your generosity, and we thank you for supporting the church. To read more, [click here](#).
