The Commission on Appraisal of the UUA published a report in 2005 entitled “Engaging Our Theological Diversity”. The following comes from that report:

While the root of the words of the term theology refer to “reason or discourse about God,” these questions assume a much broader understanding of its meaning. In modern usage, the definition of theology is understood to include the full range of religious and philosophical beliefs (not just theistic ones) and humans’ understanding of the meaning and purpose of life and of Ultimate Reality.
